# HOW TO FIND US

Writtle University College is located in the village of Writtle, 2 miles from the only city in Essex, Chelmsford. The University College is accessible from Chelmsford by bus, car and cycle path.

#### Postcode for Sat Nav is: CM1 3RR

### By Car

Writtle University College has ample on-site parking for students and visitors. We are clearly signposted from the A414 Writtle bypass. If approaching from the east, take the A1060 Sawbridgeworth Road from Chelmsford, as far as Lordship Road, and follow the signposts to Writtle University College.

### By Rail

Chelmsford station is approximately 10 minutes' drive from Writtle University College. Chelmsford has regular services from Liverpool Street and Norwich and Colchester.

### **By Shuttle Bus**

There is a free shuttle bus from Chelmsford Railway/Bus Station area on a first come, first served basis during term time, during peak times.

### By Bus

First Buses Nos 45 and 32 take you to Writtle Village Green, approx 10 minutes walk from the main campus. Route No 46 stops right outside the campus.

### By Bike

There is also a cycle route that leads directly into Chelmsford which takes approximately 20 minutes.







### MAKING YOUR JOURNEY EASIER

Getting to and from our campus should be the least of your worries! Thankfully, there are plenty of transport options to make your journey to WUC as easy as possible.

#### Shuttle Bus

We run a shuttle bus\* to and from Chelmsford train and bus stations. There's no fee and no need to book - seats are on a first come, first served basis.

#### **WUC Minibus Scheme**

We run a minibus service\* on three direct routes\*\* across Essex. Places on the WUC minibuses are limited and allocated on a first come, first served basis. Priority is given to full-time students between 16 and 19 years old. Depending on availability, the service is available to part-time students for a standard fare.

#### **Travel Assistance**

If you are a student between the ages of 16 and 19 and live in Essex, you can apply for assistance with travel fees to WUC through Essex County Council, as part of their Post 16 Transport Scheme. Each local council operates their own travel scheme and policy. Please contact the council in the area you live in for specific information. Students at WUC can get discounted fares with Greater Anglia Railway and First Essex Buses.

### IT'S ALL ABOUT ME!

Maths and English (ME) isn't just about words and numbers - a good understanding of both subjects will be valuable throughout your life. It means you are more likely to progress in education, find a job and grow in your future career.

At WUC, you will continue to develop your skills in Maths and English throughout your studies, whatever your ability.

### You are not alone!

Around four out of ten teenagers leave school without a GCSE at Grade C or Grade 4 in Maths and English. A fresh start at college studying something you enjoy, can really help.

If you are 16 to 19 years old and don't have a GCSE at Grade C or Grade 4 in Maths and English, you will study English and Maths qualifications through Functional Skills or GCSE alongside your course. If you are over the age of 19, you will be encouraged to do the same.

If you already have a grade C, 4, or above in GCSE English and Maths, you will continue to develop your skills during your classroom sessions and assessments.

Don't worry! We will support you along the way and help you to be the best you can be.







### EXPLORING YOUR OPTIONS

You might not want to stay on at school after you've finished your GCSEs, but you are required to stay in education or training until you're 18 years old. Or, you might be an adult learner looking to get back into education, either to make a career change or develop your skills or interests. Whatever you are searching for, Writtle University College could be the place for you!

We know it can be confusing choosing which study level is right for you. Whatever subject and course you choose, you will leave WUC with a substantial vocational qualification recognised by employers and universities, meaning you can find a skilled job or continue studying. To help, here's a quick guide to what some of the qualifications at WUC mean:

### Levels 2/3 Work-based Qualifications

These highly practical qualifications mean you will learn from work related tasks designed to help you develop the skills and knowledge to do a job effectively.

### Level 2 Technical Qualifications

Your studies will be focused on enabling you to specialise in a technical job or area. You could go straight into employment or an apprenticeship or continue studying at a higher level.

#### Level 2 Firsts — Certificates/Diplomas

Your studies will combine theory and practical learning in your chosen subject area. You could go straight into employment or continue studying at a higher level.

### Level 3 Nationals — Certificates/Diplomas/ Technical Diplomas

An excellent alternative to AS or A Levels, these courses are designed to give you the theoretical and technical skills needed to work in a particular industry. You could also go on to study at University.

### **KEEPING OUR STUDENTS SAFE ON CAMPUS**

Satisfactory reference from most recent school, college or employer.

### Level 3 Certificate / Diploma / Extended Diploma

- 5 GCSEs A\* to C or 9 to 4
- Must include English and Maths

Satisfactory reference from most recent school, college or employer.

\* For the Level 3 Advanced Technical Extended Diploma in Animal Science we also require Science at a minimum of Grade 6, as well as the standard Level 3 entry requirements.

Writtle University College is one of the leading land-based institutions in the UK and we welcome people of all levels of Agricultural experience. By studying Agriculture at WUC, you could play an important role in developing the future of British and International farming.

Food production is at the heart of the UK farming industry, including dairy, beef, pig, sheep, vegetables, cereals, and root crops – and our range of courses focus on this too.

You will learn theory in the classroom and apply it to practical experiences, giving you a greater understanding of the industry. You will get hands-on experience on WUC's farm and work extensively with our own livestock throughout your studies. You will learn about state-of-the-art technology and machinery, and develop useful skills such as; tractor-driving and forklift operations. You will gain specialist knowledge in relevant issues such as animal welfare and sustainability, whilst improving your understanding of arable and livestock studies, and business management.

There is an emphasis on animal science alongside practical learning covering topics such as husbandry, conservation and wildlife, zoo and exotic animals, and kennel and cattery management.

During your studies, you will delve into biology, anatomy, physiology, ecology and behaviour – and apply all the theory you learn to practical experiences.

You will learn how to safely handle and care for a wide range of species and to maintain and promote their health by looking after their basic living and nutrition needs. You will practise basic veterinary nursing skills such as applying bandages or practising techniques for safely restraining different animals, and will also learn essential animal first aid, in addition to developing vital skills in customer care and business management too.

Choosing a course in Animal Management at WUC could take you into a range of roles such as a veterinary nurse, zoo keeper, animal collection manager, or rescue centre worker.

You could go onto study a higher education diploma or degree in animal science, management and behaviour, or zoology and veterinary nursing.

If you are passionate about a career in Animal or Veterinary Science, our new pathway in Animal Science will provide you with the necessary skills and experience to allow you to develop a career in this exciting sector.

### Did you know?

- This programme is equivalent to 3 A-Level in Science subjects and allows you to progress onto university to study Veterinary medicine, Veterinary Physiotherapy, Bioveterinary Science or Animal Science.
- WUC has its own dedicated animal centre, with dedicated aquatic, reptile and companion animal rooms.
- To enhance your learning, you will complete a relevant work experience placement in the animal industry as part of your course
- You will study a range of modules including Animal Health and Husbandry, Animal Behaviour and Communication, Biological Systems of Animals, Animal Welfare and Breeding, Biochemistry and Microbiology

### **Ready to discover?**

Studying Animal Science at WUC is the ideal way to explore the diverse career opportunities available to you in the animal industry. There is an emphasis on animal science alongside practical learning covering topics such as husbandry, wildlife and ecology conservation, and exotic animal health and husbandry.

During your studies, you will delve into Fundamentals of Science, Biochemistry and Microbiology, Chemistry , Inheritance and Genetics and you will undertake a Science investigation – and apply all the theory you learn to a practical investigation.

You will learn how to safely handle and care for a wide range of species and to maintain and promote their health by looking after their basic living and nutrition needs. You will practise basic veterinary nursing skills such as applying bandages or practising techniques for safely restraining different animals, and will also learn essential animal first aid, in addition to developing vital skills in customer care and business management too. Choosing a course in Animal Science at WUC could take you into a range of roles such as a veterinary surgeon. veterinary nurse, bio veterinary scientist, animal nutritionist. zoologist and many others. Scientific organisations, such as pharmaceutical or medical research companies employ animal scientists to undertake research. There are opportunities to be involved in protecting the food chain and increasing food supplies, or protecting welfare of animals in a variety of different settinas.

You could go onto study a higher education diploma or degree in animal science, management and behaviour, or zoology and veterinary nursing or medicine.



## Are you ready to groom our canine friends?

To study Dog Grooming at WUC, you will need some experience of handling dogs. Practical lessons take place in our dog grooming parlour. By working directly with the general public and their dogs, you will gain experience in customer care and hands-on dog grooming practice. Importantly, you will finish your studies with a qualification trusted by owners and the industry.

You will learn about all aspects of the dog grooming industry including points of the dog, techniques for safe handling and control, Kennel Club breed groups, normal and abnormal health and hygiene, how to care for different coat types, how to recognise and care for skin conditions, parasites and infectious diseases and essential first aid for dogs.

You will practise techniques such as bathing, drying, caring for ears, eyes, skin and nails, using and looking after equipment including combs, scissors, and clippers.

You will also learn how to plan and design a grooming parlour and study basic business and management skills, as well as key legislation. To enhance your studies, we recommend you find work experience in a grooming parlour. Additionally, by Level 3 you are expected to have a work placement in a grooming parlour.

# EQUINE

## Are you ready to pursue your dreams?

By studying at WUC, you will spend most of your time on our dedicated equine campus which is home to around 50 horses, including those for riding. Our specialist facilities include two indoor arenas, an outdoor arena, and a horse walker. We also have facilities for breeding and stud work.

In the core modules of the courses you will learn about equine health, stable routines and tack fitting, but you will also study diverse and innovative units such as equine behaviour and therapy, horse training techniques, the biological systems of a horse, and event management. You will develop practical skills such as grooming, clipping, riding and lunging as well as equine first aid. Yard duties are also a key part of every course.

When you complete your studies, you will be equipped with the relevant experience you need to begin your career. You could go on to work in sports, such as racing, polo or training horses or train as a riding instructor. You could find a job in nutrition, welfare or equine insurance or work as a competition groom or yard manager.

When you've finished your studies, you could find a job in the sports industry and work in areas such as coaching, performance analysis, sports therapy, marketing, fitness centre management, nutrition, psychology, personal training or teaching. If you study outdoor adventure you could go on to work in outdoors or expedition planning and leading.

Your qualification will also prepare you to study a sports-related subject at a higher level, such as a higher education diploma or degree.

## **VETERINARY NURSING**

## Are you ready for the challenge?

To study Veterinary Nursing at WUC, you will be interested in animals, biological sciences, anatomy and physiology. You will be good at problem-solving and be prepared to uphold a position of responsibility in a complex and high-pressured environment.

This is a work-based qualification; to apply you must already be employed as a student veterinary nurse in an approved training practice. There, you'll complete 1,800 practical hours and will attend WUC one day a week.

You will learn important practical skills including administering medication, taking x-rays, monitoring anaesthetics, minor surgical procedures such as suturing, in-patient care, applying bandages and dressings, taking observations and maintaining records of treatment.

You will also gain experience in a laboratory, examining bloods and other samples for bacteria and viruses. You will be providing information to, and educating owners about, the best care for their pets and learn how to run clinics covering issues such as weight-management and socialisation.

Study Veterinary Nursing at WUC and you will become a registered professional with the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (RCVS) and be licensed to practice as a qualified Veterinary Nurse. You will also leave with a SQP (suitably qualified person) qualification and be entered as an SQP-C on the VetSkill register.

You may go on to specialise in a variety of veterinary practices including surgery, exotic animals, nutrition, or emergency, and critical care, or could find employment in related industries including animal nutrition, pharmaceuticals, research and teaching.

## YOU MATTER TO US

Starting college should be an exciting, challenging and enjoyable time and we are keen to help you get the most out of your time at WUC. Some students need a little help, advice and support along the way and that's where specialist support teams can step in.

### **Providing an equal platform**

We welcome applications from students who have a disability, learning difficulty and/or mental/ medical health conditions, and actively encourage early disclosure of support needs. This helps us consider reasonable adjustments and/or allows us to look to put in place some additional support for you right from the start of your course if you are likely to need it.

If you are deaf or hearing impaired, we can provide one to one support to assist you throughout your course. We have our own specialist team of communicators who can provide British Sign Language (BSL), Sign Supported English (SSE), note-taking or a combination of all three. Communication support can be available for off-site visits, tutorials, one-to-one sessions, open days and interviews. Our two largest teaching spaces are also fitted with hearing loop systems.

We may be able to make special arrangements if you need specific adjustments for examinations and assessments. Access arrangements vary depending on your needs but could include extra time, use of a computer, readers/ scribes and adapted materials. If you are struggling with your course work, you do not need to have a diagnosed disability or specific learning difficulty to benefit from the support available. You can contact the learning support team at any point to discuss what support you may be able to access.

### Wellbeing Support

Students at WUC benefit from being part of a small and close knit community. You will be assigned a course and personal tutor who you will have regular contact with and you would be able to address any concerns about your course or college work. In addition, in the wellbeing team, there a small team of Advisers, who can provide help and advice on personal. emotional or practical problems. as well as specialist mental health support. Through our trained BACP Counsellor we are able to offer a term time confidential counselling service.

In addition, the Wellbeing team run wellbeing events & initiatives throughout the year and provide:

- Residential student out of hours support;
- Safeguarding advice, help and action & Sexual Violence Liaison Officers to support survivors of sexual violence;
